1. ABOUT US

An overview

Friends of Lanka (FOL) Inc. has its roots dating back to 2019 August when a group of Sri Lankans residing in Melbourne came together to carry out humanitarian and community welfare activities in both Sri Lanka and Australia. The initial members registered FOL as an incorporated corporation, thus making its operations more effective, efficient, and transparent. FOL launched its Flagship project Help Learn by providing school stationery and school bags requirements of 210 disadvantaged students from the rural areas of Sri Lanka. Since then, FOL has been steadily increasing the number of students benefitted by Help Learn and this year 520 students from 6 districts have been assisted by this project. FOL also engaged in two local community projects which included a Blood Donation Program and a Clean Up Australia project. FOL has engaged in other projects which would be detailed elsewhere in the Annual report.

FOL understands the donations received are hard earned by our donors and hence utmost care is taken in the way the money is spent. We maintain our transparency regarding the way we conduct our business operations.

Objectives

The broader objective of FOL is to implement various socio-cultural, economic, and environment related welfare programs to support the advancement of communities in need, and the protection of our planet.

FOL executes a range of projects aligned with its mission, with the primary goal of ensuring that the generous donations it receives directly benefit the most deserving communities and are optimally utilized to support meaningful causes.

Program Structure

The FOL implements different projects under three main program areas.



Help Enterprise is an initiative aimed at promoting the establishment of new small businesses in rural communities and providing ongoing support to help these enterprises grow and thrive.

Help Education is a project dedicated to supporting schoolchildren by facilitating access to education, enhancing facilities and resources, offering aid during critical situations, and fostering opportunities for vocational training and higher education.

Help Community & Environment is a multifaceted initiative encompassing various areas of focus, including environmental and wildlife conservation, disaster relief efforts, social transformation initiatives, as well as public welfare and civil rights awareness campaigns. This comprehensive project is committed to making a positive impact across these diverse domains.

3. OUR PROJECTS & ACTIVITIES

After enduring the worst period of the COVID-19 pandemic, the global experience of high inflation, coupled with the continually rising interest rates, adversely affected people's capacity to make donations towards welfare activities. Despite challenging economic conditions, FOL not only continued to support a larger community through its Flagship project HELP LEARN but also expanded to include new projects. This year FOL initiated a new project called "HELP EARN" to facilitate income generation for economically disadvantaged families. Additionally, FOL launched a pilot project to introduce reusable sanitary pads to a group of disadvantaged school children with the objective of reducing high absenteeism amongst schoolgirls during their menstruation. With a modest member base, FOL was able to support a larger community thanks to the generosity of our donors, well-wishers, and friends.

HELP LEARN



FOL firmly believes that children are our future and therefore, regardless of their economic backgrounds, every child deserves equal and equitable access to school education. Taking this issue seriously, under the HELP EDUCATION program the flagship project HELP LEARN was launched with the aim of reducing school dropouts in underprivileged communities due to economic hardships. Each year through HELP LEARN children from low-income families are provided with school stationery and other essential items needed to continue with their schooling for the year. This year FOL added the underprivileged district Monaragala to the HELP LEARN project thus increasing the number of recipient children to 520. With the expansion of HELP LEARN project Monaragala District was added which increased the recipient children to 520. Monaragala district is considered to be one of the most poverty-stricken districts in Sri Lanka.

It's disheartening to hear of the high absenteeism amongst the schoolgirls in remote Sri Lanka during their menstruation. FOL trialled a pilot project under the HELP EDUCATION program, by providing the reusable sanitary pads to 60 students from the Bakamuna District. Based on the success of the project FOL intends to extend the recipient school children to cover the other districts.



RANLIYA SUPPORT (Under Help Enterprise Program)



Ranliya Kulagana Society is a small home based manufacturing business operated by a group of highly skilled women in Padaviya of Anuradhapura district who make their living through the manufacturing of mosquito nets, school bags etc.

Under the HELP ENTERPRISE program, FOL supported the Ranliya Kulagana Society through the purchasing of all the requirements of school bags and pencil cases for its HELP LEARN project.

FOL purchased 520 bags and pencil cases for its 2023 HELP LEARN Project, which includes the 230 fabric bags which are used for the students who already have the school bags from the previous years.

Computer Chairs donated to Balaharuwa MV

Upon receiving a request from the Balaharuwa Maha Vidyalaya, FOL funded the purchase of 12 computer chairs for the school, allowing them to initiate computer usage.




Blood Donation Day

Under Help Community and Environment program we organised our first ever Blood Donation drive at the Mount Waverly Red Cross Blood Donation Centre in January 2023. It was heartwarming to see the 26 attendees who turned up on an early Saturday morning to be a part of this worthy cause.

HELP EARN

As outlined in last year's annual report as a future endeavour, FOL initiated an income-generating project with an economically disadvantaged family. The family's income producer had to stay at home due to their family situation. We provided a cow to enable them to generate income through the sale of dairy products. We are pleased to report that the project has been successful, and the family is now earning a sustainable income to support themselves."



Clean Up Australia Day

For the second consecutive year, we participated in a Clean Up Australia event at the Jells Park Wheelers Hill in March. On a sunny Saturday morning, we spent a few hours collecting litter along the lake's path, preserving the natural environment and creating a pleasant setting for the public. It also provided an occasion for a social gathering to the FOL members and the other supporters who turned up on the day.



Fund raising event — The Sri Lankan Food Fair

FOL held a Sri Lankan Food Fair for the second successive year with the aim of raising money for its Flagship Project HELP LEARN. Despite being a small organisation, we are grateful for the tremendous support from dedicated volunteers who work tirelessly to ensure the event's success. Even under unfavourable weather conditions there was a turnout exceeding expectation. With the funds raised FOL hopes to extend the number of recipients and to include another district to the existing five districts.





Donation of Laptops and near new dothing with books

We sent eight boxes of new or near new clothing and books to Monaragala district. Three computers that were in almost new condition were also donated to three undergraduates from Sri Jayewardenepura University and Moratuwa University who could not afford to buy laptops which were essential component to their studies.

This is FOL's third completed financial year since its registration.




I am pleased to present FOL's financial statements that provide the details of income, expenditure, and the financial position, together with some financial highlights depicted below.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 30 JUNE 2023

Note 1 - Statement of significant accounting policies

1.1 Statement of compliance

The committee has determined that the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial report is a special purpose financial report which has been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

1.2 Income tax

The organisation is a not-for-profit community service association and is exempted from income tax under section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

1.3 Revenue

Donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

1.4 Goods and Services Tax(GST)

Note 2 Cook at Bank and DayDal

The organisation is a not-for-profit community association; the turnover of which is less than the threshold of \$150,000, therefore not registered for GST.

1.5 Contribution of volunteer services and goods

Contribution of volunteer services and goods to the association during the reporting period were unable to quantify and recognise in the financial statements.

- Supporting disadvantaged families to start income-generating activities
